




## Type of Incidents






### Locations of Incidents





### ZOOM IN: Violent incidents and police raids









### Summary & Analysis

#### **Shiite militancy**

- ✓ There were 4 shootings in al-Qatif, Eastern Province this month targeting 1 police officer, 2 civilians, and 1 former councilman. 1 bank was also targeted in an arson attack.
- ✓ In the high likelihood that some or all were conducted by Shiite militants, this would mark a continuation in the type of attack (small arms) but a **shift in target** from primarily security personnel to include civilians and current/former public officials, and possibly even banks. The latter may be due to their opposition to or refusal to cooperate with anti-government elements.
- ✓ During **2 police raids** in al-Qatif, **2 suspects were killed**.

#### Sunni militancy

- ✓ Police kill 1 IS suspect and arrest 1 other in a raid in Ar-Rayyan, Riyadh. This comes as part of a rise in pre-emptive operations targeting IS suspects since the beginning of the year.
- ✓ The English-language Kuwait Times reported on March 5 that an Egyptian male IS suspect was arrested at a border crossing trying to enter Saudi Arabia. This was never confirmed.

#### **Conflict**

- ✓ At least 6 ballistic missiles were intercepted. This does not include a Houthi claim, without evidence, that a Burkan-2 missile struck central Riyadh. This claim was accompanied by local reports that a missile fired toward the Asir Province was intercepted, which would mark the 7th interception.
- ✓ The Burkan-2 is claimed to be a long-range, locally made "Scud-type missile" with some sources claiming a range of 1,400 km. Even if this is confirmed, the threat from ballistic missile attacks remains low due to its anti-missile defence systems.
